In 1962, worldwide expansion was approved, and today Kiwanis clubs are active in every part of the world.

### **What does the name "Kiwanis" mean?**

The name "Kiwanis" was coined from an expression in an American Indian language of the Detroit area, *Nunc Kee-wanis*, which means, "we trade" or "we have a good time."

### **How many Kiwanis clubs/members are there?**

There are more than 8,400 Kiwanis clubs with nearly 280,000 members in 96 nations and geographic areas.

### **What is a Kiwanian?**

An active or retired business and professional man and woman who is member of a Kiwanis club.
