Soccer Concession Stand Opens

“The concession stand is open from 9 a.m. to noon on Saturdays,” says activity coordinator Scott Splichal. “We set up about 8 - 8:15 a.m. and start tearing down at noon. Getting everything ready (setting out tables, making coffee, getting supplies out of the storage area and on the tables, icing down the drinks, etc.) takes about 30 to 45 minutes, depending on how many people help. Tearing down and putting things away takes about 30 minutes, again depending on how many people help. The concession will be open through September 29, but closed Labor Day weekend. **September 8, team picture day** is usually very busy, and we will probably need three or more members to help to make it easy on everyone working.”

How/Where/When did Kiwanis begin?

The first Kiwanis club was organized in Detroit, Michigan, USA, on January 21, 1915. A year later the Kiwanis Club of Hamilton, Ontario, Canada, was chartered, and Kiwanis International grew rapidly into a leading service club in these two founding nations. In 1962, worldwide expansion was approved, and today Kiwanis clubs are active in every part of the world.

What is the Kiwanis Motto?

"Serving the Children of the World"

What does the name "Kiwanis" mean?

The name "Kiwanis" was coined from an expression in an American Indian language of the Detroit area, *Nunc Kee-wanis*, which means, "we trade" or "we have a good time."

How many Kiwanis clubs/members are there?

There are more than 8,400 Kiwanis clubs with nearly 280,000 members in 96 nations and geographic areas.

What is a Kiwanian?

An active or retired business and professional man and woman who is member of a Kiwanis club.
